

Romans 1:13-23

Now I do not want you to be unaware, brethren, that I often planned to come to you (but was hindered until now), that I might have some fruit among you also, just as among the other Gentiles. I am a debtor both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to wise and to unwise. So, as much as is in me, I am ready to preach the gospel to you who are in Rome also. For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, "The just shall live by faith." For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who suppress the truth in unrighteousness, because what may be known of God is manifest in them, for God has shown it to them. For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even His eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse, because, although they knew God, they did not glorify Him as God, nor were thankful, but became futile in their thoughts, and their foolish hearts were darkened. Professing to be wise, they became fools, and changed the glory of the incorruptible God into an image made like corruptible man—and birds and four-footed animals and creeping things.

Believing Creation

“In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.” These first words of Scripture, when taken literally, offer an explanation for the origin of the universe and all it contains, “making no apology for the fact that the account involves supernatural creation *ex nihilo*, creation of something from nothing.” It is this clear claim of supernatural creation that prompts many today to doubt the integrity of the Bible, due to the wide acceptance of evolutionary theory. “Evolution is not now confined to biological evolution, to which Darwin’s name is attached, but has become an ideology that extends onto virtually every area of human activity, including politics.” (Quotes: Ian Taylor, “In The Minds of Men: Darwin and the New World Order”).

The general public has been kept from the fact that there are gaping holes in the theory of evolution. Attempts to plug these holes have been repeatedly made by scientists in re-defining and reinterpreting the scientific evidence. For instance, in order for evolutionary theory to stand, the earth age must be in excess of billions of years, yet so many observable facts deny this possibility. Scientists know that the sun’s constant source of energy is in conflict with old-earth theory. At first this was explained by “sun contraction” under its own gravitation. When this proved to support a young earth, the theory was dropped for a nuclear fusion theory. However, in view of the fact that billions of years of sun’s nuclear fusion would bath the earth in subatomic particles called neutrinos, and that there is no evidence of these particles, this theory also was abandoned. The rotation of the sun and the earth, comet age, missing radiogenic helium, stalagmite and stalactite formation, oil well pressure, and even earth population growth, all point to a very young earth. These points are only a small representation of “holes” in one area of evolutionary theory – “earth age.” When other areas such as fossil records, geological formations, species propagation etc. are examined, more “holes” become evident.

God explained man’s inclination to turn away from Him over 2000 years ago: “For since the creation of the world His [God’s] invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even His eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse, because although they knew God, they did not glorify Him as God, nor were thankful, but became futile in their thoughts, and their foolish hearts were darkened. Professing to be wise, they became fools, and changed the glory of the incorruptible God into an image made like corruptible man----and birds and four-footed animals and creeping things.” (Romans 1:20-23). Man would sooner believe a lie, even when the evidence is against it, that acknowledge the existence of God, because to acknowledge God’s existence is to accept accountability. Scripture declares: “It is appointed unto men once to die, and then the judgment” (Hebrews 9:27). The Bible says God created and God will judge, have you considered the implications of this?
